











ANCIENT ART - Egypt

<p>Canon</p>	<p>A rule (for example – of proportion)</p> 	
<p>Colonnade</p>	<p>A series or row of columns, usually spanned by lintels</p> 	
<p>Column</p>	<p>A vertical, weight-carrying architectural element, circular in cross section and consisting of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a capital a shaft a base (sometimes omitted) 	
<p>Ground line</p>	<p>In paintings and reliefs, a painted or carved baseline on which figures appear to stand.</p> 	
<p>Hypostyle hall</p>	<p>A hall with a roof supported by <i>columns</i>.</p> 	
<p>Ka</p>	<p>In ancient Egypt, the immortal human life force.</p> 	
<p>Mastaba</p>	<p>Arabic, “bench”. An ancient Egyptian rectangular brick or stone structure with sloping sides built over a subterranean tomb chamber connected with the outside by a shaft.</p> 	
<p>Mummification</p>	<p>A technique used by ancient Egyptians to preserve human bodies so that they may serve as the eternal home of the immortal Ka.</p>	
<p>Obelisk</p>	<p>A tall, four-sided shaft of stone, usually tapered and monolithic, that rises to a pointed pyramidal top.</p>

Palette	<p>1. In Ancient Egypt: a slate slab used for preparing makeup.</p> <p>2. A thin board with a thumb hole on which an artist lays and mixes paint.</p>		
Pylon	A simple and massive gateway with sloping walls.		
Sphinx	A mythical Egyptian beast with the body of a lion and the head of a human.
